NSS Annual Special Camp

The NSS unit of Ismail Yusuf College organised seven day camp from 09/02/2018 to 15/02/2018 in Grammangal Ashram School, Aine. Tal.-Dahanu, Dist.-Palghar. The total number of 44 students participated in this camp. There were 23 girl students and 21 boy students.

The inauguration of NSS programme was done by Shri Shyam Sonawane on 09/02/2018. The students were divided into different groups to conduct various events and programmes in the Camp. The schedule of seven day camp was finalised on that day.

On the second day of camp, students participated in shramdan by doing cleaning, and building work. Through this activity students realised importance of physical labour, and their collective ability to bring positive change in the society. After shramdan, students visited patil pada, the tribal village. This visit made students aware about life and problems of Tribal people.

On the third day of camp, students visited the Aanganwadi, (nursery) in the local area. The students had interaction with students and teachers of Aanganwadi. On the same day, students also visited rice mill in the area. Due to this visit, students came to know about working condition of mill. Students had interaction with the members of management. Most important students had first-hand experience of working condition of labour class. Prof. Prakash Parkhe delivered a lecture on Astronomy in the evening.

On the fourth day camp, the students visited the local area. In this visit, students observed people, Culture, and environment of the village. The visit was enriching experience for the

students. Due to this visit, their understanding of villagers and village life was enhanced. The students had dialogue with Sindhutai Ambike who is very famous social worker of the local area. She spoke in detail about her motivation, struggle and experience of social service.

On the fifth day of camp, the students actively participated in the creation and development of Waste management pit. Through this activity, students realised the importance of waste management. They came to know more about sustainable development. The main aim of NSS is to spread awareness in the society. Therefore, students performed a street play on social evil of child marriage. With the help of this programme, students discussed the problem of child marriage. One group of unit organised health awareness campaign in the village, students tried to convey the important of health to the villagers.

On the sixth day the debate competition was organised in the camp. Students participated in the debate by putting their point of views. Debate was enlightening experience for students as well as for the villagers. The students performed street play to show effects of alcohol and child marriages in the society.

On the seventh day, students visited another nursery school in nearby village. They compared the previous school and with this school. In the afternoon, there was farewell function of the camp. The representatives of village expressed their sincere gratitude to students for their contribution to the village. Students shared their personal experience. Dr. Eknath Phutane and Prof. Prakash Parkhe guided students about the role of NSS in the making our nation. At the end of the

programme, Prof. Pravin Rathod expressed vote of thanks. The MOTO of NCC is:

The activities for the academic year 2016-17 began with the enrolment of students in first year NCC.
